Welcome to the first edition of our "Governor Parent Newsletter". One of our aims as governors is to improve our contact with parents and carers and to raise awareness of the work we do. The governing body is responsible for setting the overall strategic direction for the school and monitoring its performance, rather than being involved in the day to day running of the school, so for many parents we are aware that we can appear remote from the everyday life of the school. We are hoping that the introduction of our governor newsletter will help you feel that you have a better understanding of who we are and what we do.

In this first edition we want to introduce you to the members of the governing body and to tell you about some of our responsibilities. It is our intention to produce the newsletter twice yearly. We will be sharing with you our Governing Body activities and some of the areas of general interest that we have been looking at during our meetings. what is a governing body?

All state funded schools are required by law to have a governing body. The governing body oversees the development of the school but does not deal with the day to day management of the school which is dealt with by the Head Teacher and staff.

The governing body's main responsibilities are to:

- Help set the school's aims and objectives.
- Allocate and control the school's budget, from funding of staff to investing in buildings or equipment.
- Support and challenge the head teacher and together take positive steps to improve the school.
- Monitor and evaluate progress.
- Appoint senior staff.
- Ensure the accountability of the school in line with statutory requirements.

Each year the Governors along with the Senior Leadership Team set a new School Development Plan. This school year our priorities have been as follows:

- Key Issue 1:-Raíse the percentage of pupils working at 'expected levels' and above in Writing, in line with national data.
- Key Issue 2:-Consistently good teaching in Science (in preparation for Brookfield obtaining the Primary Science Quality Mark)
- Key Issue 3:-Reduce incidents of unacceptable behaviour; Increase pupil/parental understanding and positive perceptions of strategies used for dealing with bullying effectively
- · Key Issue 4:-SLT+GB marketing of school within and beyond local community

In pairs or as individuals we monitor the progress and impact made in reference to each priority within the School Development Plan and in other key areas, such as Finance, Health and Safety and Safeguarding.

Pupil Premium

Our school receives Pupil Premium funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years. This year we have been granted in the region of £120,000 which is spent on ensuring that these children are able to achieve to the best of their ability. This is described as "narrowing the gap" by the Government.
