Play and Learning Leader	£15,900	Provide support for vulnerable children who are not making adequate progress	Extra support has been given to children including Lego Therapy, social skills groups and booster groups for Maths and Literacy. 64% of these children made at least one band progress in Maths, 67% made at least one band progress in Reading and 81% in Writing. One band = from Below to Emerging or from Emerging to Expected.
FLO	£ 6,227	To raise levels of well-being. To support home-school communications and improve parental engagement. To provide social and emotional support for children. To help improve attendance.	This year our FLO has supported over 30 children and their families. Of these children, all of them have raised levels of well-being (leuven Scales). 6 out of 10 children who were supported for attendance issues, made improvements in attendance.
Lunchtime Nurture Group	£1,000	Supporting socially vulnerable children	This group was attended by at least 20 children each week. It enabled them to practice social skills such as sharing, being supportive of each other, and turn taking. Throughout the weeks they were modelled the correct use of language to help them with

			forging friendships with their peers.
Breakfast Club	£2,500	Improve attendance and prepare children for the school day ahead.	Of the children offered free breakfast club, their attendance is all now above 93% - (before 87%). Punctuality has improved from 89 late sessions to just 23.
Staff Training and Development	£5,000	Staff training to support specific needs of the children eg. Lego therapy, Clever Fingers, ASD Awareness	Levels of involvement and well-being have improved in the children participating in Lego Therapy. All staff are aware of ASD traits and the strategies to use in order to support these children
Administration staff	£7,000	Assisting teaching staff in the preparation of resources to enable teaching staff to focus on meeting the needs of all pupils.	Specific resources used by children in receipt of PP have been prepared to help enable them to engage in the school curriculum.
Providing 1-1 support	£34,000	Identifying and supporting individual needs to fulfil pupil potential.	These children have been intensely supported throughout the year to enable them to better cope with whole class situations and to help with their social integration. They are now working in the classroom for the majority of the day alongside their peers.
Beanstalk Reading	£1120	To improve reading skills and reading comprehension.	All 6 pupils who have been supported by Beanstalk have made progress in their Reading comprehension. 100% of the year 5 children made at least one band improvement. One band = from Below to

			Emerging or from Emerging to Expected. The year 6 children made an average of 4 points progress in the year – this is accelerated progress.
Language Link	£200	To assess children's understanding of the use of language and provide strategies to be used for support.	All children assessed to require additional support in the understanding of Language have benefitted from tailor-made input. Re-assessments will be carried out in the next academic year.
Reading resources	£360	To provide story sacks to help encourage reluctant readers.	These have been used by our year 3 children and have helped improve Reading Age scores by over a year.
Off-Site Educational Provision	£500	An off-site resource for children who require additional support	The children have benefitted from this equipping them with social skills to help them manage better in class.
Transport for off-site provision	£2,100	To enable children to access off-site educational support.	Without this transport, the children would not have been able to access the off-site provision (see above).
ICT Provision	£8,000	Equipment and resources to support the new computing curriculum.	New resources have been purchased including headphones and tablets. All children can now access ICT in their classrooms.
Play Therapy	£880	To help develop emotional well-being	Children who have accessed this resource have benefitted from special 1:1 time. Leuven Scores have improved from 3 to 5
