Dear Parents and Carers

Looking forward to next year and next term, there are some changes that will be taking place within our lessons. As we further embed the government's new English curriculum









we are putting a greater emphasis on the grammar skills, which are sometimes referred to as 'SPaG' (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar). The children are expected to show their understanding of these skills within their own writing.

Having looked carefully at our year group data for English in Yrs 3, 4 and 5, our analysis has highlighted that some children are still needing support for their sentence structure, whilst others are needing further opportunities to develop their vocabulary and their extended writing. To address these differing needs we are grouping our children accordingly across the year group for their English lessons during the next 2 terms. When we meet with you again at Parent Consultations in March, we'll be able to share the impact and progress within their books.

In Terms 5 and 6 the children will remain with their class teacher for all subjects. In Yr6 our children are preparing for the end of Key Stage SATs and will stay with the same class teacher for all subjects.

In the meantime, it just remains for me to wish you and your families a festive Christmas and a Happy New Year.



We look forward to the children returning to school on Tuesday 5th January ~ Breakfast Club will start on the first day; School Clubs and Crazy Feet start the following week.
