We began with a focus on Science and activities from our STEM day were displayed at the Science Fair. Visiting parents, governors, and children from Brookfield Infants and Lunsford Primary School all gave really positive comments regarding our children's enthusiasm and abilities to explain and discuss their activities on display. We are also well underway with our application for The Primary Engineer Young Leaders Award ~ all children in the school have met with engineers to discuss their jobs, find out more about particular areas of engineering and ask their own questions. This has been a huge success – the children have all asked pertinent questions and many are now considering how their own futures may involve engineering. We entered 227 designs into the national competition and we eagerly await the results.

We are also eagerly awaiting the chirruping of tiny chicks as a pair of blue-tits are currently nesting in our Bird Box!!!

Book Week followed and we took a magical theme with opportunities to dress-up, visit the local library and to enter reading competitions. Theo the Magician gave us a mesmerising assembly full of tricks and wizardry and we had the opportunity to try some card tricks for ourselves. The Book Fair was popular and I hope the children are enjoying their new purchases. Altogether they spent just over £900 (an absolutely amazing amount!) ~ which meant that we now have lots of new books in our class reading corners. Yr5 have been reading all about magic and wizardry and they had a great visit to Harry Potter World.

Across the whole curriculum, we engage our children's interest with many varied activities and wonderful experiences. This term we have included a cultural afternoon learning all about life and traditions in Russia and a Spelling Bee. We hosted our first Football Tournament for teams of Yr3/4 pupils from 7 local schools. The School Council and Eco Council have begun creating our Sensory Garden area and encouraged us to take part in the 2017 Waste Week Campaign where the children considered aspects of recycling, E-waste and landfills. We have been keeping fit and healthy by walking a mile-a-day around the playground and for Comic Relief the children took part in sponsored silences, and all sorts of fun activities which helped to raise our biggest total ever ~ £1320.20. The children readily gave their time and support and we thank you for your generosity towards this charity.

In this last week we have also enjoyed the lovely dance display from the Crazy Feet dancers, and of course the absolutely wonderful Easter Assembly led by Yr5.

May I also draw your attention to the email (at the end of the letter) received from Young Voices ~ which is an activity and charity that we supported this year.

As you can see, the whole Brookfield Staff Team has worked tirelessly to organise such exciting activities for the children and their families ~ and I thank them for their dedication and hard work.

Plus of course ~ Thank you to the tireless efforts of our valiant PTFA who organised the Mother's Day Secret Room, the refreshments for the Football tournament and the Easter Raffle (with its visually tempting display of goodies!).

Altogether 140 children enjoyed some fun activities with their mums and special ladies who visited on Bring Your Mum to School Day. We hope you also liked their small gifts to you. There was a great turnout for the Special Easter tea organised by Contract Dining and I know for those of you who attended that it was a delicious treat indeed.













It was also lovely to see so many of you at the recent Parent Consultations. I was pleased to hear your positive comments regarding the children's enjoyment of school activities and the pleasing progress they are making.

We have a few changes of staff to tell you about. Mrs Penfold has left us from Breakfast Club to concentrate on her studies to become a Teaching Assistant. We have also welcomed the return of Miss Down, an art specialist, who has begun working on creative projects with Yr4 classes.

Across the whole curriculum we promote learning skills that will enable our children to develop their potential and make good progress. We have also congratulated our weekly Learning Heroes who have excelled in their efforts.
